Fire resistant construction is a concept of passive fire protection in building construction whereby materials and systems are selected based on their ability to resist or limit the spread of fire and smoke. From the height and area limitations of the code to the type of construction and requirements for compartmentation, the selection of these systems is directly related to the expected transfer of heat or smoke from a fire to and through building components. This seminar is intended to introduce code officials to fire resistant construction from a conceptual and scientific approach. It will explain the various fire resistance testing procedures, as well as provide a fundamental understanding of construction materials and how they provide the intended protection level. Changes to the 2012/2015 NJ-IBC are also included.
