Did you know? There is a Permit Extension Act in place?

It's true The Permit Extension Act of 2008 was enacted as a result of the economic decline. The Act allows for permits and approvals to remain valid and not expire as they would under the normal regulations. Here are some brief examples of the Act:

The Permit Extension Act extends all permits that were open and valid as of January 1,2007. Under the UCC rules, a construction permit lapses if (1) no work is done for a year or (2) work, having been started, is discontinued for six months. (See N.J.A.C. 5:23-2.16(b)) The following are some examples of how certain scenarios would be affected by the Permit Extension Act:

Examples:

1. Construction permit was obtained prior to January 1, 2006 and no work was done. The permit has lapsed and is not revived by the Permit Extension Act because it was not a valid, open permit on January 1, 2007.

2. Construction permit was obtained on April 1, 2006 and no work was done. The permit was deemed to have lapsed as of April 1, 2007. However, the permit is now deemed to have been revived by the passage of the Permit Extension Act. Since it had been valid for three more months as of January 1, 2007, it will continue to be valid for three more months as of July 1, 2010, and its new expiration date, if it is not acted upon, will be October 1, 2010.

3. Construction permit was obtained on October 1, 2006 and no work was done. The permit was valid for nine more months as of January 1, 2007 and is now deemed to have been revived, and to continue to be valid as of July 1, 2010. However, since a permit that is only valid because it was extended by the Permit Extension Act can only remain valid for six months following the end of the extension period, the permit would only be valid for six more months, and would expire on January 1, 2011, if not used by then.

4. Construction permit is obtained between January 1, 2007 and January 1, 2010. Though the time would not begin to run until July 1, 2010, the permit would expire on January 1, 2011, since the Permit Extension Act does not allow any extensions beyond January 1, 2011 unless the permit would have continued in existence beyond that date had the Permit Extension Act not been adopted.

5. Construction permit is obtained after January 1, 2010. Since the permit is valid for a year, it is unaffected by the January 1, 2011 cut-off date and expires one year from the date of issuance, just as it would if the Permit Extension Act had not been adopted.

New Jersey Association of Technical Assistants Procedures for Technical Assistant of the Year

1. Association Presidents will notify association members that they are accepting nominations for Technical Assistant of the Year up to the end of November.
 2. Association Presidents will have selected their association nomination by December 31st.
 3. Association Presidents will have their nomination to the State Association Secretary by the 2nd week in January.
 4. State Association Secretary will then forward the nominations and a ballot to each association President.
 5. Association Presidents to present all nominations to their association for a vote.
 6. Association Presidents will report the results to the State Association Secretary by the second week in February.
 7. A final vote will then take place at the State Association Meeting at the end of February. In the event of a tie the Association Presidents will have the final vote.

Fall Continuing Education Seminars are Now Available

SEMINAR REGISTRATION

If your code enforcement license expires January 31, 2010, please keep in mind that the fall semester runs from September 9 through December 18, and you must complete your continuing education requirements during this time period.

ALL CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS MUST BE MET WITHIN THE REGULARLY SCHEDULED PROGRAM.

Registration for Uniform Construction Code/Hotel & Multiple Dwelling officials and inspectors who are working in code enforcement begins upon receiving this brochure.

Procedure:

Open registration for all other licensed inspectors begins one week after receiving this brochure. Unless your license expires January 31, 2010, you will be limited to either two seminars or one per subcode in which you hold a license (whichever is greater). This will give everyone an equal opportunity to register. If you have completed your CEU requirements for the current license period, you would be allowed to sign up for one (1) additional seminar. To register for more seminars above the required amount, you should call one week before the start date of the seminar in question.

1. Decide on a first and second choice from the seminars being offered; in case your first choice is filled, you should have an alternate selection in mind. The DCA staff person who takes your call can answer questions concerning fulfillment of your education requirement for the current licensing period.
2. Call the DCA Education unit at 609/984-7820 between the hours of 9:00am and 4:00pm. Be sure to have the following information ready:

- Your municipality and UCC/HMD position (for working officials and inspectors)
 - Your code enforcement license number
 - Seminar number (located opposite the seminar title)
 - Date and location of the seminar you want to take
3. You may also email your registration to education-unit@dca.state.nj.us. Acknowledgement of receipt will be sent via email. If you use email to register and there is space available, you will be registered for the seminar whether you are a working or non-working official.
- Confirmation:**
- Confirmations are mailed approximately two weeks before the date of each seminar. If you have not received the confirmation one week in advance of a seminar for which you registered, call the Education Unit at 609/984-7820 to make certain your name is on the roster. Walk-in registrations are not permitted.
